Minutes from the Annual General Meeting held on March 13, 2016 were presented. Motion by Jim Williams and seconded by Al Schyf that they be accepted. Carried.

Treasurer's Report:

- Treasurer's report presented by Mike Toller
- Accounts audited, reconciled and balanced.
- Club is in great financial shape, has been for a number of years, and expect this to continue.
- \$18,546.12 in bank
- \$3827.15 profit due to budgeted money for bonspiel support not being used.
- Sponsorship income (~\$7500) used for club support and bonspiels.
- Budget for next year presented, basically the same as this year, but plan to increase league and bonspiel support next year (\$6600 vs \$5300 this year).
- Have fair amount of cash in bank, therefore decision to form a subcommittee to look at major expenses (examples of past major expenditures: rocks, televisions for lounge). Looking for any interested ECC members to join subcommittee to plan out expenditures for next 3-5 years.
- Motions by Jim Williams, seconded by Samantha Cameron to accept report. Carried.

New Business:

- 2017/18 Bonspiel Dates all leagues have responded with dates for bonspiels/funspiels
 - Golden Girls moving from Wednesday to Tuesday will affect Dave Davies' x-mas party, but this will be worked out
- 2017 Open House Sunday, September 24. Encourage everyone to bring someone new to get engaged in curling.
- Motion: Esquimalt Curling Club to suspend the use of all hair brooms as of December 31, 2017.
 - Motion by Ken Whitehead, seconded by Brian Moran
 - o Discussion:
 - Why?
 - Curl Canada moratorium bans hair brooms for sweeping
 - Some brooms are not in good shape and leave debris on ice
 - Rec Centre host bonspiels and have rental brooms, most of which are hair
 - Gloria Will the rules be same as nationally can use hair brooms as throwing device? Ken W. answered: intention is a complete ban
 - Mike T- polled he senior select league the youngest broom is 20 years old, some are over 30 years old.
 - Doug M Sportsmen league encourage members to get new brooms, but won't support motion because some league members have new hair brooms. Suggest each league should monitor its members' brooms.
 - Jim W if we go after brooms, can we go after grippers too? Should be a decision at the league level, not club level.
 - Al T discussion arose at Exec meeting re grippers and moved to brooms. Motion is about cleaning up and enhancing the ice. Grippers are cheap. Possible to get a group discount or other deal on brooms.
 - Jim W- can't control brooms outside of club e.g. if municipality rents ice for a bonspiel
 - Gloria noticed a lot of dirt/debris being tracked into hallway from outside
 - Ken W responded, that we got a longer mat to try to reduce dirt. Reminder that it is a
 public building with access for all. Leagues need to encourage everyone to use boot
 cleaner before going on ice.
 - Vote on motion rejected.
